



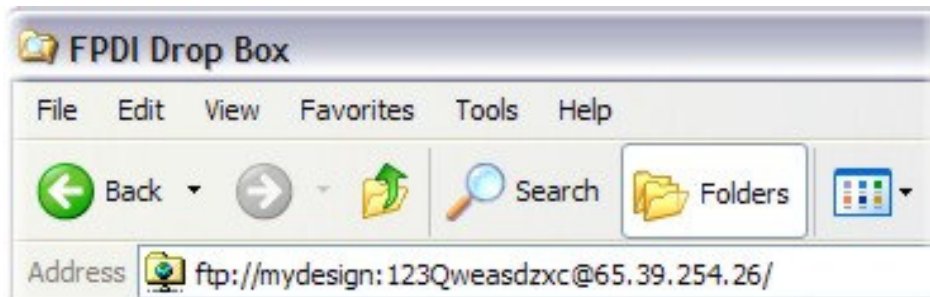
FTP Upload—Method 1—Windows

Apparently this also works for some Linux based file explorers too. Open up a Windows Explorer window (Not Internet Explorer):



Add the following text to the 'Address' bar and either hit 'Go' or 'Enter':

`ftp://mydesign:123Qweasdzxc@65.39.254.26/`



Files on the FTP site will now be displayed in your Explorer window.

Drag and drop files from your computer to the FTP site. A status window will appear as files are being uploaded. This will disappear once all files selected have been uploaded.

Note:

- This is a semi-private server. All accessing users can see files. If you want your files to remain confidential, encrypt and compress them with WinZip. Make sure you tell Floating Point what the password is!
- Make sure you tell Floating Point which file is yours and when it's been successfully uploaded.

FTP Upload-Method 2—Everyone Else

This method is for those of you who want to use an FTP client, or some operating system that hasn't dragged itself into the 21st Century yet.

FTP Site IP Address: **65.39.254.26**

User ID: **mydesign**

Password: **123Qweasdzxc**

Make sure that you set the file transfer mode to binary, and then do whatever you have to do to upload the files.

Sorry, we don't use this method—you're on your own from here on in. We'd love to help you out we really would, but we just don't have the time or resources. Call your friend who 'knows about computers'. Tell him or her that you're trying to upload a file to an FTP server.
